AP English Inclement Weather Unit Plan Focus Text: <u>Frankenstein</u>

Essential Question: How are the issues addressed in Mary Shelley's <u>Frankenstein</u> relevant to today's society?

Learning Targets:

- 1. I can determine the underlying meaning of a text.
- 2. I can use graphic organizers to solidify my comprehension of a text.
- 3. I can effectively respond to my reading of a text.

Instructions:

This unit consists of 10 days of lessons. Each lesson must have a formative assessment.
